



Dress Code

This policy includes the process for approval of School Uniform

Rationale

A student Dress Code and School Uniform:

- reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance,
- instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and
- assists in developing pride in representing the school.

Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the School Uniform.

Aims

The aim of this policy is to provide the Dress Code for students at St Richard's as well as the approval process for the School Uniform.

The aims of the Dress Code and School Uniform are:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To ensure school uniform is practical and addresses health and safety standards.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with the school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for the school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation

1. This policy applies to students at St Richard's and is approved by the School Advisory Board (SAB).
2. The School Uniform (see Appendix 1) describes the approved items of uniform able to be worn by students in accordance with the requirements of the Dress Code. The School Uniform is approved by the Principal and the Leadership Team in consultation with the Parents Association (PA) & Uniform Sub-committee.
3. The School Uniform applies on Standard School Days, i.e. prescribed school days when students attend a standard school program, during school hours (8:30am – 3:30pm), while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions unless otherwise explicitly stated. Non-standard school days, e.g. sports day or other themed day, may be advised by the Principal from time-to-time on which occasions an appropriate form of dress will be published by the School.
4. Summer, winter and sports uniforms are prescribed in the School Uniform, and are required to be worn in accordance with the Dress Code.
5. Stud earrings or sleepers and watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
6. Non-natural hair colours and/or extreme hairstyles are not permitted on standard school days. On non-standard school days hair designs relevant to the theme of the day may be permitted.
7. It is an expectation that all hair is off the face and where possible tied back if long enough to do so. Hair which is longer than shoulder length must be tied back.
8. Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn by students at school.

9. The only headwear that is acceptable is School hats consistent with the school Sun Protection Policy. Hats must be worn when outside during Term 1 and 4. Hair accessories may be school colours navy blue, yellow or neutral colours.
10. The school will operate a second hand uniform shop.
11. Periodic review of the School Uniform will be coordinated by the SAB/PA and a Uniform Sub-committee. The Uniform Sub-committee will make recommendations on variations to the School Uniform through the SAB/PA to the staff and the Principal. The Principal is to be satisfied that there has been an adequate consultative decision making process implemented prior to approving the recommendation based on the following principles:
 - a. provides a sense of school identity,
 - b. provides some choice for the students while promoting equality,
 - c. allows for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities,
 - d. caters for the financial constraints of families (i.e. cost effective), and
 - e. meets relevant OH&S standards.
12. The approved School Uniform, including details of uniform items and places of purchase, will be:
 - a. included in the annual parents handbook,
 - b. provided to the school's uniform supplier (and other suppliers on request), and
 - c. when amended, phased in/out over a period of time determined by the staff in consultation with the SAB.
13. Enforcement of the Dress Code and School Uniform is the responsibility of the Staff. Where students refuse to comply with the authorised direction of staff the school will communicate with parents advising of the requirement (see Appendix 2).

Evaluation

This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's review cycle.
